



We've been able to accomplish these goals this year in new and exciting ways as we have resumed regular youth programming, meeting roughly twice a month for a variety of fellowship and service activities. We have been getting













anywhere from 7-15 students participating in these activities this fall. Participants have enjoyed getting to know one another through events such as a bonfire and a trip to Spieker's Pumpkin Farm. They've also had fun serving their neighbors by packing sack lunches for Milwaukee Rescue Mission, holding a "Trick-or-Treat So Others Can Eat" food drive for the Saukville Food Pantry, and serving dinner at two different meal sites in Milwaukee.

Later this month, we will be helping to host a Christmas party for the children housed by Family Promise, and we look forward to partnering with them again in the spring to put together Easter baskets for the children as well. Other things on the horizon for 2023 include a skiing/tubing outing, a youth conference in the WI Dells, and a multi-day mission trip this summer (stay tuned for more info on these events coming soon!)

Lighthouse, like all of us, has been on quite a journey over the last few years. It has not always been easy, but as we look back at 2022, we are thankful for the many hands and hearts that have shaped this ministry and are very excited about where God will lead us in the year(s) to come!

Grand Avenue United Methodist Church is seeking candidates for the position of Administrative Assistant. The person in this position will be a critical contributor to our ministry. They need to be dependable, enthusiastic, personable, self-directed, and able to work with confidential information. This individual must be willing and able to work alone, with the pastor, and with congregational members.

The role requires a solid understanding of Microsoft O365 (Word, Excel, and Outlook) and an ability to learn a member management application, presentation tools, etc.

Responsibilities include:

- Serve as the church receptionist
- Prepare the weekly Sunday bulletins
- Prepare and distribute the monthly Newsletter
- Inventory and order all church supplies
- Serve as the communication link and resource person for the congregation
- Update and annually distribute the church directory
- Other duties as directed

The part-time position is planned for 20 hours per week. The working hours are flexible, with some remote work a possibility. Starting pay is \$20/hour.

2022 Financial Update:

For 2022, all bills are being paid and there is no borrowing. Our apportionments are on schedule to be paid in full this year. Your giving has been generous in support of our ministries at Grand Avenue UMC. Your support of our Noisy Collection causes is being celebrated by those in need of our support.



2023 Budget Planning:

The Finance Team and the Administrative Council have been working on the 2023 budget. After a number of revisions, the Administrative Council will be completing a final review of the 2023 budget at their meeting on Thursday, December 8th.

Pledging this year is \$118,575. This amount is down \$21,411 as compared to the 2022 amount of \$139,986. All other sources of budgeted income, except for the craft booth (up \$2000) are the same as in 2022. Our planned 2023 income is budgeted at \$151,228.



Key changes to our 2023 expenses are:

- Apportionments are reduced by \$2,194 since we moved to a half-time minister
- Utilities are increased by 15% or \$2,100 based on anticipated rate increases for electric, natural gas, water, and wastewater
- Wages are reduced by \$7,295 based on the revised plan for the replacement office administrator
- Ministry programs are reduced by \$8,590. The Lighthouse Youth Ministry, Senior Ministry, and Music Ministry are still funded.

Our planned 2023 expense is budgeted at \$153,887.

This will result in a budget deficit of \$2,659.

The Finance Team and the Administrative Council will continue to monitor our income and expenses on a monthly basis to see if further changes need to be made.

WI CONFERENCE NEWS

Wisconsin Annual Conference 2022 By Sue Killey

The Wisconsin Annual Conference (WAC) met with 2/3 of the delegates present in Green Bay and 1/3 of delegates on-line June 11-13, 2022. The conference theme was, "Discerning God's Will for All," based upon Romans 12:1-2. We are called to model healing dialogue, restore our commitment to the beloved community of raised awareness of racial justice and radical inclusion. Our conference honored cultural diversity including sacred drumming by our local Native Americans, mission dinner with our South Korean guests, recognizing new Hispanic congregations, enjoying music from Hmong congregations, and reflecting on poems and texts by Langston Hughes, an African-American author.

The conference business began with approval of the consent agenda, routine items such as youth ministries and camp promotion. Next the budget for 2023 was presented. During 2021, the Conference received over 1 million dollars that supported over 125 programs across the state. WAC ended 2021 with \$180,941. The allocation percentages for the 2023 budget were presented. The full budget presentation can be found at www.wisconsinumc.org.

The basis for the settlement for the Boy Scout Survivors' Trust Fund is our principle of restorative healing. The settlement commits the UMC to provide \$30 million as a part of the total financial settlement of \$850 million. Our Wisconsin Conference portion is \$208,096. The Bishop does not want to add this amount to our apportionments, and instead would like special local offerings to raise those funds. Approved. Going forward all local congregations need to review and update their Safe Sanctuaries Policies on an annual basis. These policies are working as Wisconsin has had no victims come forward since the adoption of them.

Three churches: Hixton, North Prairie, and Bloom City were approved for discontinuance based on declining membership and attendance. All members were encouraged to join nearby UMC congregations.

Trinity UMC in Waldo petitioned for disaffiliation and discontinuance from WAC based on old language of the Book of Discipline (not having to do with human sexuality language from the 2019 special General Conference.) This is a difficult process with a majority of Trinity's membership voting to separate and paying to WAC for future pensions and the property. Members wishing to remain United Methodists were encouraged to join nearby UMC congregations.

Other important approved resolutions included: Support for Reproductive Health Care Rights and Justice, Development of Comprehensive Sex Education Curriculum by Discipleship Ministries, and Resolution Formally Requesting the Congressional Delegation from Wisconsin to Act on Responsible Fire-Arm Legislation.

The WAC nominated Rev. Dan Schwerin as a candidate for Bishop to the North Central Jurisdictional Conference. Jurisdictional Conference met at the beginning of November, and Rev. Schwerin was elected Bishop. He was assigned Northern Illinois Conference. Rev. Schwerin led a new church start in Hartford, Still Waters UMC.

Bishop Jung presented the State of the Church. He advised us that when we know who we are as United Methodists, then we know what our mission is. We are people of both personal and

social holiness and are to be involved in introspection for our own journey related to anti-racism. We are called to recognize, repent, and restore our relationships with Native Peoples, Boy Scouts, and victims of our historical attitudes. We need to speak well of those who leave the UMC, but no one needs to leave. John Wesley spoke earnestly of unity until death. We need to think of ourselves as servants of Christ and as stewards of God's Earth.
