

Dear Grand Avenue Church Family and Friends,

We enter December and the season of Advent. Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas and is intended to be a period of spiritual preparation leading up to Christmas Day. Today the Advent Season is more commonly referred to as the Christmas Season.

The Christmas Season is by far our most revered holiday of the year and it is impossible to escape the importance placed upon it in our country. The images of Christmas are everywhere. Our homes and streets are filled with colorful lights and Christmas decorations. Every store and business is promoting the season. There are numerous parades, events, and gatherings. We are constantly inundated with a steady stream of Christmas advertisements on our televisions and phones. No one can doubt that the days leading up to December 25th are dominated and focused on preparing for this celebration.

However, the Season that was originally instituted to provide a period of mindful spiritual reflection on the importance and significance of the birth and return of the Messiah has become increasingly centered on consumerism and not Christ. As I step back and analyze the modern Christmas/Advent Season, I am struck by how little focus is placed on Jesus. In fact, outside of our church communities and activities, there is virtually no mention of our Savior. How strange that a holiday that is so universally known and celebrated worldwide has almost no focus on the reason for its existence.

As we enter this Advent/Christmas Season let us reconnect with the reason for the season. Let our Lord's Word protect us from the bright, glittering lights of commercialism so that we won't be blinded to the true significance of Christmas and the need to pursue more meaningful preparation. Let us prayerfully center all of our preparations and celebrations on Jesus Christ and consciously seek to prepare our hearts to meet our Lord.

Isaiah 7:14, "Therefore the Lord Himself will give a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call His name Immanuel."

Galatians 4:4-5, "But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth His Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons.

John 1:14, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth."



United Methodist Corner

In this season of Advent, we are faced with the question, "What is the meaning behind our belief in the second coming of Christ." The Gospel lesson on the first Sunday in Advent every year focuses on Jesus' return. I'll admit that this thought is a confusing one for many of us. We might just be tempted to ignore it or downplay its importance in the life of the church. We are reminded of Christ's return each time we celebrate communion. Together we say in the communion liturgy, "Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again. The pastor says in part, "make us one with Christ, one with each other, and one in ministry to all the world until Christ comes in final victory and we will feast at his heavenly banquet table." We have victory in Jesus when he was raised from the dead. Final victory points to the final fulfillment of God's plan for the world in the return of Jesus.

The word Advent means "coming". Advent is not confined to our preparation for Christmas. Advent is our hope for Christ coming into our lives throughout the year and in his final return. One thing that turns some of us off is the fixation by some Christians to want to set a timeline for Christ's return. They do this in spite of Christ's words that no one but the Father knows when that will be. Instead of getting all tied up in knots about the exact time of Jesus's arrival or how he will arrive (e.g. in the clouds with the sound of a trumpet), perhaps we are better served by focusing on why Christ is returning. We learned something in our small group study that I believe opens up our understanding of Christ's return. Author Matt Skinner writes that the 2nd coming signifies that God is still committed to the world. We are assured that God is committed by God's willingness to come to us in Jesus and experiencing first-hand the suffering and vulnerability of being a human being. God is committed to the world by raising Jesus from death to life. We also know that Christ's birth and his resurrection from the dead did not magically end the suffering and brokenness of the world. The world is not where God desires it to be.

The promise of the 2nd coming is our ultimate hope because it will bring fulfillment to our petition, "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven." The second coming is the assurance that God has not abandoned this hurting world. God will continue to work through Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit to bring all things to fruition. God is working to bring God's peaceable kingdom where weapons will be turned into plowshares and the world will not learn war anymore.

We are called to become part of God's restoration project. Our founder, John Wesley, took a very positive attitude when it comes to both personal and societal transformation by the spread of holiness. Our giving and discipleship is not confined to a season. Our hope is in the Lord who can make all things new. Our hope is also active.

We work together to bring hope, joy, and peace to the world until Christ comes again in final victory.
