Coming Inside for Worship Beginning Sunday, May 2 10:00 am

In-person inside worship services in the sanctuary will start on the first Sunday in May (May 2). This has been a long wait, and we thank everyone for patiently and supportively bearing with us as our local church leadership continue to responsibly navigate through this pandemic with our safety in mind. At the April Administrative Council meeting it was decided to start in-person indoor worship services according to Wisconsin Council of Churches safety guidelines. This is a return to the sanctuary, but it is *not a return to normal*. For a while it will be a *new normal*.

The main doors to the church (cross and flame door, and power door) will be open at 9:45 am, 15 minutes before the worship service starts at 10:00 am. Attendance will be monitored, including the contact information of visitors, in case contact tracing becomes necessary if someone becomes sick. There will be no gathering or waiting in the entry area behind the sanctuary; as you arrive you will be greeted and seated immediately by a host. Face masks will be required of all, and social distancing will be maintained. Every other pew row will be available for seating. The entry path into the sanctuary will be down the center aisle. A bulletin will be provided, but hymnals and Bibles will not be available in the pews. You are encouraged to bring a Bible from home. Congregational singing remains a very high-risk activity. All worship music will be by performance only; you may hum along or sing *softly* inside your face mask. Offering plates will not be passed from person to person; an offering box will be located at the sanctuary door. Worship leaders and speakers, when not wearing face masks, will be distanced in the pulpit or at the altar only. Service length will be managed to last between 30 and 45 minutes. The worship service will be livestreamed for those who are not ready yet or cannot attend. At the end of the worship service, you will be dismissed by a host to maintain social distancing while inside the building. All socializing after the worship service must take place outdoors.

It is not the same as before, but it is a way we can assemble in person for now. Pastor Don will be preaching on May 2 and May 9. The sacrament of communion will be offered on May 9. On May 16 (the target date CUMC plans to start in-person indoor worship in Cedarburg) a rotation schedule will begin on Sunday mornings with service leadership from the shared ministry team.

I look forward to seeing you in worship. We have been waiting a long time. Let's do this well!

A Message from Stevie Stibor, Regional Mission Team

Commitment

Commitment is something with which we all struggle, at least with some things at certain points in our lives. But it is also such a crucial part of living a full, uncompromised life. So why is it so hard to have committed focus on things that are important to us? Time? Daily pressures of life? This is just to name a few but we all know the list can go on and on. But what if we learned new skills, new ways to manage our time, new methods to focus on what truly matters? That could be a game changer, right? So, let's try.

What are the most important things to which we should commit ourselves? Remember, you are reading an article within the church newsletter, so I am hoping you thought to put God at the top of your list. But you may have also thought of health, family, career, etc. Whatever is on your list, learning to show commitment is a fluid skill so once you master it, it can be applied repeatedly in many areas of your life. The biggest hurdle is truly believing that what is important *is* important. Not just something you say but something that is worthy of action, of practice, of discipline.

To run the race of life, you need to train and grow stronger every day. Growing in faith is not something that happens by merely cramming more information about the Bible into your brain. All that knowledge means nothing if we do not give ourselves opportunities to experience what that knowledge can do in our hearts. To fully experience faith, we need to practice our faith. And that takes commitment. While this article is mainly focused on growing our relationship with God, the message within can be applied to any area in your life that you hold in high regard. This is about persistence, determination, discipline and above all else, putting our words into action.

Keep practicing what matters most. "In a race, all the runners run. But only one gets the prize. You know that don't you? So run in a way that will get you the prize. All who take part in the games train hard. They do it to get a crown that will not last. But we do it to get a crown that will last forever." (1 Corinthians 9:24-25 NIV) My husband used to own a personal training business and he would always tell his clients not to train to get in shape for a specific occasion but instead train to get your body and mind as healthy as it can be for the long haul. Because when you prepare for an occasion, that day will come and go and once it passes, you lose your motivation. You no longer have a date you are working toward, so you are more likely to fall back into your old ways. That is kind of what 1 Corinthians 9:24-25 is all about. Do not train to win a game that will come and go but train to win a life with God. A life of abundance that is present every day.

Practice hearing from God. "'So then, everyone who hears my words and puts them into practice is like a wise man. He builds his house on a rock. The rain comes down. The water rises. The winds blow and beat against that house. But it does not fall. It is built on the rock. But everyone who hears my words and does not put them into practice is like a foolish man. He builds his house on sand. The rain comes down. The water rises. The winds blow and beat against that house. And it falls with a loud crash.' Jesus finished saying all these things. The crowds were amazed at His teaching. That's because He taught like one who had authority. He did not speak like their teachers of the law." (Matthew 7:24-29 NIV). This reading is about proper foundations just as commitment is about building something unwavering. When we just talk about things, that is like building a house on sand. It falls away at the first storm, the first trial, the first obstacle. Having a committed relationship with God is about building something strong, something that stands the test of time, something that cannot be broken by earthly complications. It is about putting active practice behind our words. It is that practice that changes the sand into stone and makes our commitment unbreakable.

Practice praying to God. “One day Jesus was praying in a certain place. When He finished, one of His disciples spoke to Him. ‘Lord,’ he said, ‘teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.’ Jesus said to them, ‘When you pray, this is what you say. Father may your name be honored. May your kingdom come. Give us each day our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we also forgive everyone who sins against us. Keep us from falling into sin when we are tempted.’ (Luke 11:1-4 NIV). How very powerful prayer is! In times of trial, in times of rejoice, in all times we turn and should turn to prayer. This is how we communicate with God. The practice of prayer helps us to grow closer to Him. Just as we must study for a test or spend time practicing or training for sports, we should make time to spend with God.

Practice living for God. “Jesus sat down across from the place where people put their temple offerings. He watched the crowd putting their money into the offering boxes. Many rich people threw large amounts into them. But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins. They were only worth a few pennies. Jesus asked His disciples to come to Him. He said, ‘What I am about to tell you is true. That poor widow has just put more into the offering box than all the others. They all gave a lot because they are rich. But she gave even though she is poor. She put in everything she had. That was all she had to live on.’ (Mark 12:41-44 NIV). This reading is about much than money; it is about putting all you have into what you do, especially into your relationship with God. You can either be all in or you can be only partially in. Does your faith shine through throughout your daily life or is it only apparent on Sundays or when it serves a purpose? To live a godly life takes practice. It takes commitment.

It all comes down to this, “Training the body has some value. But being godly has value in every way. It promises help for the life you are now living and the life to come.” (1 Timothy 4:8 NIV). The bottom line is that commitment is making a plan and putting that plan into practice.

I hope this message finds you all safe, healthy, and happy. Peace be with you all.


