

Hello Grand Avenue Family and Friends,

For the August Newsletter, I would like to do something different. Two Sundays ago, after the reciting of our Lord's Prayer, I added a second version. At the suggestion of a few of our sisters in the faith, I have included here. This is in no way an attempt to rewrite scripture or alter the words of Jesus Christ; rather, it is intended to illustrate the need to seek a deeper understanding in the teaching our Lord provides us in His Word. The Lord's Prayer is a model prayer, that is to say, that the purpose of the prayer our Lord gives us is to teach us the proper way to pray. As I contemplated that, I sought to personalize that prayer, and this is what I came up with. Again, the value here is to seek to embrace and deepen our faith through greater understanding of the truth. To take our faith from superficial rote to spirit-moving meaning.

The Lord's Prayer - Seeking a better appreciation of the model (prayer posture).

My Father, who is in Heaven, I remain mindful that your name is holy and must be revered.

As I desire first your Heavenly Kingdom, I also desire first that your will be done in my life as it is in the Kingdom of Heaven.

In your steadfast love, please grant me today your daily provision and in your infinite mercy, forgive me my sins as I seek to forgive those I feel have wronged me.

And gracious Lord, bless me with your divine favor and test not my weakness in trial and tribulation, but rather grant me the privilege of abiding in your strength and through your strength be protected and delivered from evil and the evil one.

You may have noticed the inclusion of the evil one. I say, both evil and the evil one, in my daily prayer, because of the Greek rendering. The Greek uses a definitive article (τοῦ = the) before evil. The Greek definitive article, like in English, indicates a particular person, place, or thing. In this case, the evil one (Satan). Evil vs. evil one is still debated among scholars today, and you find it translated both ways depending on which version of the Bible you read. For me, I would like to be delivered from both!

Again, I wanted to share this as a way of illustrating the power of seeking a deeper immersion in God's Word. As we enjoy the end of summer, and the days again begin to dim, let us look to God's Word to maintain the brightness of His light in our hearts.

United Methodist Corner

I want to share a quote from John Wesley in a letter to the perfectionists in London in November 2, 1762. "I dislike your speaking of yourselves as though you were the only [ones] who know and taught the Gospel; ...But what I most dislike is your littleness of love...your want [lack] of union...your want of meekness, gentleness, long suffering; your impatience of contradiction; your counting every [person] your enemy that reproves or admonishes you in love; your bigotry and narrowness of spirit, loving in a manner only those that love you...your censoriousness...of all who do not agree with you; in a word."

Do these words sound at all familiar? They were written over 360 years ago, but they could very well describe the divisiveness that is being experienced across churches today. I very much identify with Wesley's anguish as he wrote these words, because I too find it very difficult to relate to those who believe they are morally and spiritually and Biblically superior to me. As Methodists, it is a part of our DNA to strive to be open to Christians. There is a well quoted line in Wesley's sermon, "Catholic Spirit", in which he writes, "We may not all think alike, but can we not all love alike?"

Wesley's point was that we may have theological or philosophical differences with other Christians, we can still find unity in love and good works.

The Methodist movement is not primarily about embracing certain dogma. The movement is trying to follow in the way and Spirit of Christ as his disciples. We believe the Holy Spirit's work is to transform us into becoming more Christ-like in our loving and our serving. Jesus said in John's Gospel, "Love one another as I have loved you." Galatians 3:28 serves as a key scripture in our Christian living, "There is neither Jew nor Greek, male nor female, slave nor free, for all are one in Christ Jesus." Christ transcends our differences and seek to bring us together as one people.

This doesn't mean that we cannot oppose others whom we believe are going down a wrong path as Wesley wrote in his letter to the perfectionists. What it does mean is that we not treat others with the same divisive spirit as we are facing from them. We need to keep the door open and pray for those that oppose us. The bottom line is not ultimately about right answers, but right practices. Let us continue to be open to the Spirit who seeks to transform us into becoming a new creation in Christ Jesus.
