United Methodist Corner

Means of Grace is a term unique to Methodism. For John Wesley, means of grace were spiritual practices, such as prayer, that opened up spiritual channels for God's inner and transforming grace and love to work within us. He and Charles experienced these means of grace when they participated in a Holy Club while attending Oxford. Together, they had studied scripture, prayed, received the Lord's supper regularly, supported each other in holy living. They also reached out in acts of mercy to the hungry and destitute. They were committed to be a group of vibrant and disciplined Christians. It was through this experience and other encounters that led Wesley to the conclusion that there is no such thing as a solitary Christian. We can grow personally in the faith, but our faith is never isolated from others. We are a part of the Body of Christ.

The importance of Christian fellowship led Wesley to add what he termed Christian Conferencing to the list of means of grace. Within the Methodist societies that Wesley initiated, he also established classes and bands. Classes consisted of up to twelve persons met regularly to pray, read scripture, and watch over one another in Christian love. Wesley believed that in these smaller groups that members would experience the presence and love of Christ through one another. As it says in the Gospel according to Matthew, "For where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there with them (18:20). The word "fellowship" sometimes is used to mean any kind of gathering. The word "fellowship" is translated from the Greek word, "koinonia" which actually means a deeper sense of connection and bonding. It's reality is more like the Apostle Paul's call "to rejoice when others rejoice and to weep when others weep" (Romans 12:15).

Sometimes we don't know the significance of what we got until it's gone. We experienced this "lack of fellowship" during the pandemic. What a joy it was to be able to return to worship and be in the presence of fellow Christians again. But unfortunately, we are finding that less people are coming back to worship in the sanctuary choosing either to go their own way or to watch online services. One thing is clear to me. If we are to have a renewal in Methodism, we will have to return to our roots and our strength as a movement. That strength is finding opportunities to meet together in small groups in Christ seeking to grow in his grace and in our commitment to partnering with him "to make disciples for him for the transformation of the world".

One of my responsibilities as staff assistant to oversee our small group ministries. If you have any thoughts or ideas about new groups that can be initiated at Grand Avenue, please feel free to contact me.
