

United Methodist Corner

A trusted friend shared the following story about a sermon he heard on the Parable of the Lost Sheep in Luke 15:1-8. Many of us are quite familiar with the parable. A shepherd leaves his flock of 99 sheep in the wilderness to search for a sheep that was lost. After he finds the sheep, he lays it on his shoulders and rejoices. He is so filled with joy that he calls his friends and neighbors to join in celebrating the return of his lost sheep. This is how the parable ends, but there's more. According to this preacher, when the sheep's leg and breaks it. He then says, "Next time you will think twice about wandering away on your own."

If your jaw just dropped after reading this strange interpretation, you are not alone. What makes this interpretation even more disturbing to me is that it was preached in a United Methodist Church.

While I don't claim to be an experience in Wesleyan theology, I can say with certainty that the Wesleys did not view God as a God of retribution and punishment. God is not a God who seeks to keep us in line out of fear of being punished. God's nature according to the Wesley brothers was that of infinite mercy, compassion and love. God's grace is revealed the beginning of Genesis to the end of the book of Revelation. God is always seeking to draw people into His Divine Love. A key scripture in Wesley's view of God is found in Psalm 103:11-12, "For as the heavens are high above the earth, so great is God's steadfast love for those who fear him. As far as the east is from the west, so far does God remove our transgressions from us."

The shepherd in the parable does not seek to punish or shame the lost sheep. He calls us his friends to celebrate with him over the sheep's return. We are called like the shepherd to search for those who are hurting and alone and connect them with the love and tenderness of our Lord Jesus Christ and the church which Jesus has created and leads. We search for the lost because we remember well that God found us when we were spiritually lost. Like those familiar words in Isaiah 53, "All we like sheep have gone astray." We are not children of God because of our perfect obedience but because of God's great mercy and forgiveness in Christ. Knowing that God's love will never let us go, we can go forth with joy and thanksgiving in reaching out to others with compassion and peace as God's beloved community.
