



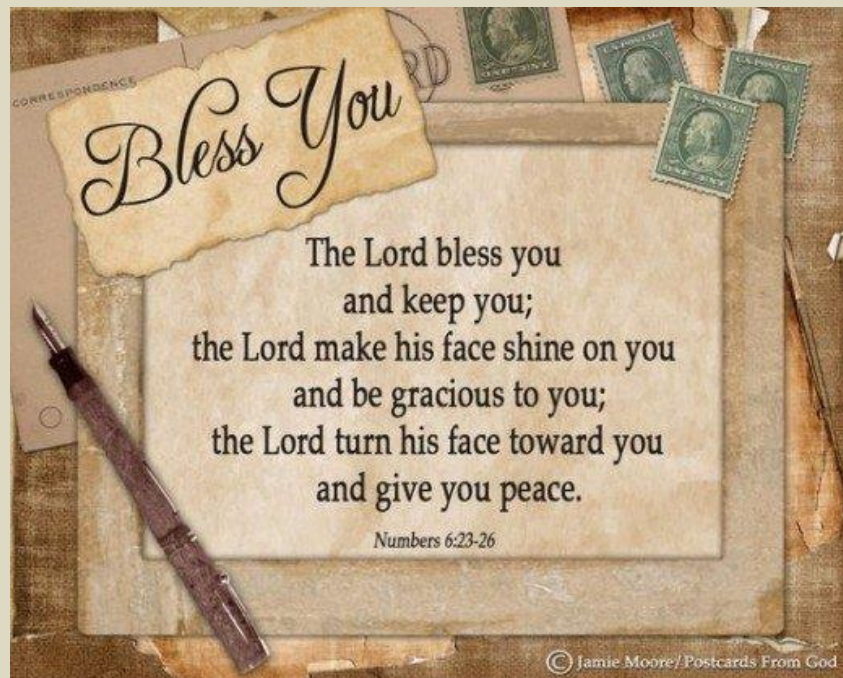

Dear GAUMC,

Thank you for giving me an opportunity to be amongst you all over the past 15 or so months. I have thoroughly enjoyed getting to know each of you, especially since we've come back post-COVID. Many of you have shown me love and have been gracious with me and for that I am very thankful. Grand Avenue UMC has something that is special – a feeling of being a part of the family when a person walks in the door. Many churches are missing this aspect of faith community, yet GAUMC has it! You've included me in your family, even if for a short amount of time, and that has not gone unnoticed.

There is so much I want to say to each of you – not because I'm wise enough to impart some deep revelation to you – but because of the urgency I sense in my own life and in the lives of countless Christians today. Our world is looking for people with real and authentic faith lives whose relationship with Jesus has changed the trajectory and course of their life. Our world is hungry for good news, and we as Christians are bearers of this Good News about Jesus. It's our lifelong journey to discover Jesus personally, cultivate that love over the years, and then share it with each other in community and then with the wider world. Living out that Good News in real and authentic ways is what the world is hungry for, whether or not they even are yet awake to the hunger!

Today it is widely possible for most people in our community to go through their lives without ever thinking about deeper questions of meaning, purpose, or whether there is a God in the first place. The broad result of such a cultural worldview is a deadening of the senses as we seek out entertainment instead of community – a dive into deeper meaninglessness – and a general malaise on the faces and hearts of many in our world. Even a short amount of time reading comments on social media has left me with the conviction that our world has chosen it's own path apart from God and is reaping the harvest of disconnection from the Life source Himself.

But those of us who have chosen to follow Jesus find our lives connected to a spring of living water that overflows within us. You (yes you!) are like a walking oasis in a dry world that is desperately searching for a drink. So I'm glad for you all; I'm happy for you all; I'm excited for you all; that the future will be full of sharing the life of God with your community – full of being bold with friends and neighbors. So be bold! Have fun! You hold within yourselves the presence of God who is Life itself. So share it! Your community, your neighbors, and your friends will thank you later.

CONTENTMENT

There are a lot of things we want in and from life. But, at the same time, we must learn to be okay with what we have. We must learn to be okay with what God has given us. We must find contentment and know that what we have is enough.

While Paul was in prison, he wrote a letter to the people of Philippi. In his letter he spoke of what it means to be a Christian and he thanked the Christian congregation he had established. He said, "I have learned to be satisfied with the things I have and with everything that happens. I know how to live when I am poor. And I know how to live when I have plenty. I have learned the secret of being happy at any time in everything that happens. I have learned to be happy when I have enough to eat and when I do not have enough to eat. I have learned to be happy when I have all that I need and when I do not have the things I need. I can do all things through Christ because He gives me strength (Philippians 4:11b-13).

Living with this kind of contentment brings peace. It relinquishes the burden of constantly striving and hoping for more. Remember, God knows exactly what we need, and He always cares for us. When we put our trust in Him, He presents us with abundance. As Christians we know this is true but the problem with it comes when we are faced with the practical application of it. We tend to doubt that God *will want* to meet *our* need. But think about this for a moment...there is NOTHING that you have that is insignificant in the eyes of God. There is NOTHING about you, about what you have to offer, that is not enough.

So, I challenge you to find happiness in the moment - wherever you are. See the goodness in what you have in the here and now. It is up to *us* to be thankful. And there is always, always, always something to be thankful for. Every day may not bring sunshine and roses, but it will not bring doom and gloom either. My prayer for each of you is to find grace in what is in front of you today. Because developing a habit of contentment will help you to overcome obstacles and release the angst of never having enough.

Everything we have comes from God. He is faithful to provide what we need. And even more than what we own, God can also provide what we need to face whatever happens in our life. God has proven time and again that we can trust Him no matter what. We can complain or become jealous of what others have . . . or we can choose to respond with contentment, knowing that God has a plan for our lives.

I want to leave you with this...at the wealthiest period of his life, John D. Rockefeller had a net worth of about one percent of the entire US economy. He owned 90 percent of all the oil and gas industry of his time. Compared to his wealth, the richest people in America today are mere paupers. Still, when asked, "how much money is enough money?", Rockefeller answered, "just a little bit more." With all that he had, he never had contentment; he never had peace. He was always chasing something more.

Find your peace. Find your contentment. Find your happiness. If you are going through a period of struggle, remember that this too shall pass. You have the grace of God on your side. You are blessed and loved by the King of Kings.

Background Information: Grand Avenue United Methodist Church is a small but active congregation with a vital ministry. The church is located in Port Washington, Wisconsin, 30 miles north of Milwaukee along the shores of Lake Michigan. Currently, it is partnered with Cedarburg United Methodist Church in a regional ministry. The Pastor and some staff are shared, with each church having its own service. At this time, Grand Ave UMC has one weekly service at 10 a.m. on Sundays.

Responsibilities:

1. Provide accompaniment for worship services, including incidental music (e.g., Prelude, Postlude, transitions as appropriate to maintain service flow).
2. Lead congregation in singing while accompanying on keyboard.
3. Provide music accompaniment for Lenten, Easter, and Christmas Eve services.
4. Accompany special music performed by others when scheduled.

Qualifications:

1. Strong keyboard and vocal skills. The ability to play the organ is an added plus.
2. Working familiarity with United Methodist Church Hymnal and "The Faith We Sing" is preferred.
3. A dependable and enthusiastic person able to work with Pastor and congregation on hymn selection, style, and tempo.

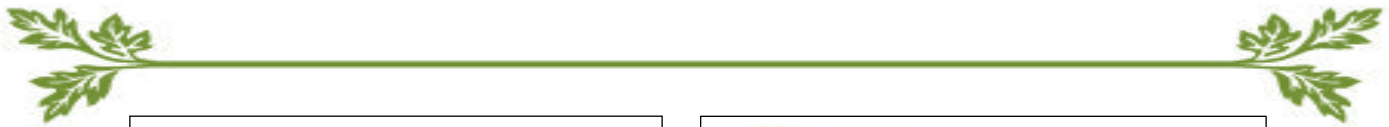
