Dear Grand Avenue Church Family and Friends,

Happy New Year and welcome to 2026. The fresh start of a New Year is typically a time in which we look forward. It is a time for fresh starts and new beginnings. It is this perspective that spawned the popular practice of New Year's resolutions. People seeking to make positive changes entering a new year that will improve their lives. 
Meal Week Thank You!


