(We will be closed on Monday December 25)



One of the key words in Wesleyan theology is salvation. Wesley wrote in his sermon on The Way of Salvation, "Those two little words, faith and salvation (I'll address our understanding of faith in next month's column) include the substance of all the Bible, the marrow, as it were, of the whole scripture"

The meaning of this word salvation has often been misunderstood. When we hear the word salvation, we tend to think of being saved for the future bliss of heaven. It's the place where we go after we die. The fire and brimstone preachers would preach on the need to be saved from the fire of hell and damnation. When Wesley spoke of salvation he meant being saved in the present moment. He argued that scripture said, "ye are saved" as opposed to you will be saved in the future. Salvation does not stand at a distance. It's not something we wait for while we passively live out our lives. Salvation has an impact in the way we live our lives today.

Salvation, in Methodist terms, consists of two parts; justification and sanctification. God's grace and mercy draws us into a relationship with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. The word justification means "pardon". Justification means to forgive us of our sins and make us right with God. "It is while we were yet sinners (unable to do any good on our own) that Christ died for us" (Roman 5:8). Christ's saving grace reconciles to God to whom we have been estranged.

The other part of salvation is sanctification. Sanctification is closely linked, inseparable from justification. Sanctification is about growing in the knowledge and love of God. It is about being renewed in the image of Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit. Salvation also means "healing or wholeness." Whereas justification is something God does for us without any effort on our part, sanctification is something that requires our trust and cooperation. Growing in Christ Jesus is not an automatic progression. It is what I call a journey of faith; with its ups and downs, peaks and valleys, detours and unexpected surprises.

I had a relative who said to me years ago that he found it troubling that he tried be faithful his entire life while someone on their deathbed can confess to the Lord and be saved. I wish I had said to him then what I have come to believe now. Salvation is more than just seeking to be saved for heaven. I cannot speak for others, but I believe that knowing Christ and allowing the Spirit to work through me all these years is the real treasure I would have lost, if I had waited to the end to turn my life over to the Lord.
